Propagation Key Tips

Forcing Protocol: Produce plug or liner to the 2 fully mature leaf stage. At the 2 fully mature leaf stage, begin short day conditions. Continue short day conditions until plant reaches 7 fully mature leaves. The 128 is the minimum size for SD grown plugs to 7 fully mature leaves. Daylength Notation

Grow plugs under SD (≤12 hours) until 7 mature leaves. Thereafter, 100% plants flower at ≥10 hours when grown under high daily light integral (DLI; ~15 moles/m²/d) and at ≥12 hours under low DLI (~5 moles/m²/d). Plants flowered ~5 weeks faster at ≥13 hours than at 10 under higher DLI and ~2 weeks faster at ≥13 hours than at 12 under low DLI. Therefore, fastest flowering at ≥13 hours.

Common Problems

Soil that is too wet during overwinter production can result in Root Rot and uneven plant development. Bark media is recommended for best drainage. Powdery Mildew.

Bulking Strategy

Short days are recommended to bulk the liners prior to long day conditions. Produce plugs to the 2 fully mature leaf stage. At the 2 fully mature leaf stage, begin short day conditions. Continue short day conditions until plants reach at least 7 fully mature leaves. Bulking can take place in the liner or in the finish container. After short day treatment, grow under long day conditions (natural or extended).
